SelfDesign®: A return to in-person activities:

As an online (distributed learning) school, the BC Ministry of Education's plan for restarting in-person classes in brick-and-mortar schools has little impact on SelfDesign®'s in-person services/activities. For each stage, the Ministry of Education requires that administrative staff of each school be on-site to ensure that cleaning, hygiene, and distancing protocols are followed. Until Stage 1 and 2 are reached and certain density and distancing requirements are reduced, SelfDesign is not able to ensure that cleaning and hygiene protocols are being followed in homes.

Stage 2	- In-class learning for all K–7 full-time - In-class learning for grades 8–12 part-time - Remote and online learning continues to be available for gr 8–12	- Density requirements lifted (allowing closer contact in educational settings) - Maintain physical distancing where possible - Maintain cleaning, hygiene restrictions - Maintain group size restrictions - If learner or contractor is sick, stay at home	<i>Under enhanced hygiene, cleaning, density protocols:</i> - In-person supports in learners' homes or outdoors allowed - In-person supports at places of business, such as offices, sports gyms, music studios, etc., provided the support providers meet the following criteria: - They have met the regulations outlined by all levels of government and have had their plans for in-person support approved by their governing body and/or WorkSafe BC. - They follow the health and safety measures outlined by the Public Health Officer, WorkSafeBC and the Ministry of Health. - Learning centres – work with each centre to develop a plan for in-person services - In-person contractor activities allowed - Family visits with educators allowed - Limited in-person camps/activities <i>If learner or contractor is sick, stay at home.</i> Note: Jam Camp, Fall Camp, and our Fall Family Gathering have been cancelled.

Stage 3	- In-class learning for K–7 part-time - In-class learning for grades 8–12 part-time - Remote and online learning continues to be available for K–12 - Administration on-site and responsible for meeting Ministry of Health requirements	- Limited density – reduced group size; small groups at a distance where possible - Maintain physical distancing where possible - Maintain cleaning, hygiene restrictions - Maintain group size restrictions - If learner or contractor is sick, stay at home	- Suspend in-person activities, including: - In-person camps/activities - In-person contractor activities - Family visits with educators - Suspend in-person supports in learners' homes or outdoors - In-person supports in the offices of professional support providers allowed <i>if they meet these criteria</i>: - They are governed by their own professional bodies. - They have met the regulations outlined by all levels of government and have had their plans for in-person support approved by their governing body and/or WorkSafe BC. - They follow the health and safety measures outlined by the Public Health Officer, WorkSafeBC and the Ministry of Health. - Learning centres – work with each centre to develop a plan for part-time in-person services.
